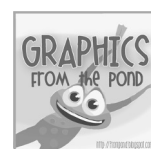

These patterns make the long E sound like in see, team, funny, equal, key.

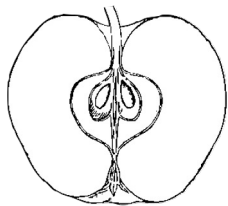

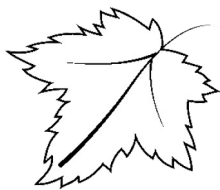

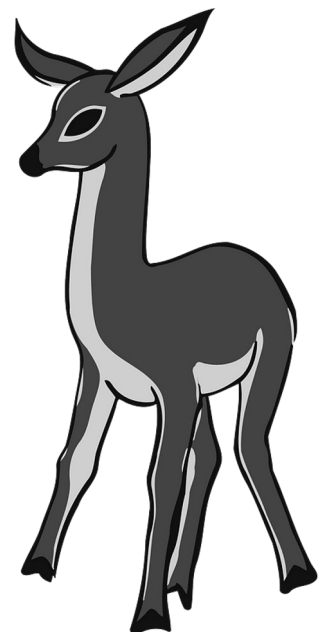
